



## 1099 Reports Availability

Schwab began mailing Form 1099s to clients on January 27, 2015. This process should take approximately two weeks to complete, so long as there are no corrected 1099s.

Form 1099s are also available for clients to view electronically after February 17, 2015 via the Caissa Website through the Schwab Login tab.

Personal bundles are in the process of being created by Denise and should be completed by the week of February 23. Once available, you can download the bundled files from the Sharefile Tab on the Caissa website. We are more than happy to share these with your accountant for your convenience.
